 - How to deal with a difficult individual or group
- 4. Understanding the role of a government employee
 - Dealing professionally and appropriately with the public

Understanding and Interpreting Written Material

- 1. Be able to read a paragraph or short essay that is provided and answer questions based on that material
 - Critical thinking and reading comprehension skills

Safe Work Practices

- 1. Basic first aid principals
- 2. Proper use of personal protective equipment as it pertains to:
 - Chainsaws, weed whips, and other gas powered equipment
 - Hand tools
 - Handling of chemicals, including those used in pool operations, pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizer applications.

Knowledge and Use of Tools and Equipment

- 1. Identification of common landscaping hand, gas, and electric-powered tools/equipment
 - How to use those tools effectively in a park setting
 - Routine maintenance and upkeep of those tools
 - How to select the right tool for the job

Irrigation Systems

- 1. Basic watering system principles and techniques
- 2. Watering frequency of turf and landscaped areas
- 3. Soil/Water relationships as they pertain to optimal plant irrigation

Propagation and Maintenance of Park Sites, Turf and Landscaping

- 1. Understand Integrated Pest Management (IPM)
 - Physical, Biological, and Chemical Implementation
 - Best management practices
 - Identifying common plant pests and diseases
- 2. Knowledge of common landscaping principles and techniques
 - Tree pruning and felling methods
 - Annuals vs. Perennials/Deciduous vs. Evergreen
- 3. Recognizing signs of plant stress
 - Nutrient, water, and light deficiencies
 - How to alleviate associated issues
- 4. Fertilizing concepts and application

- 5. Turf care practices and concepts
 - Aeration
 - Fertilization
 - Irrigating
