Proposed Material: Banner Maxx II EPA Reg. Number: 100-1326

Active Ingredient: Propiconazole <http://www.cdms.net/LDat/ld0HH000.pdf>

Amount of material needed: 2-4 oz. per 1000 square feet

Location of Proposed Use: putting greens only.

Reason why Restricted: Caution label. Not currently on allowed list in IPM ordinance.

Reason for Need: To reduce Pink Snow Mold fungus on putting greens and Tees.


Options/Alternatives: Other fungicides, including PCNB – all products that are not on approved list

Plan to Preclude Future Use: Use of organic fertilizers began in 2012 has helped to limit future use. Best management practices and compost tea have also helped reduce use.

Time Period Needed: Through April 2014. The Golf Center is committed to using low risk materials and moving toward an organic maintenance regime. They are currently in transition to this type of maintenance, but will need to use fungicides that are not on our approved list to preserve the investment in their putting greens. If not, or they will no longer be a viable alternative to golfers and will no longer get their business.
