Proposed Exemption: Applications to up to 1 acre of golf putting greens EPA Reg: N/A

Active Ingredient: Undetermined at this time

Amount of material needed: TBD

Location of Use: McInnis Park Golf Course (putting greens and tee boxes only)

Reason why Restricted: Per the County IPM ordinance application of pesticides to turf is restricted by way of exemption.

Reason for Need: Given the complex conditions surrounding the management of turf at the golf course, including mowing heights less than 1/8", the turf is highly susceptible to a variety of diseases and fungi during certain times of the year.


Options/Alternatives: The course managers continue to employ a variety of mechanical, cultural, and biological activities that include aeration, over-seeding, topdressing, fertilizing and the use of Companion, a biological fungicide that promotes turf health.

Plan to Preclude Future Use: Continue to perform alternative practices, monitor conditions, utilize biological materials as appropriate and available, such as Companion.

Time Period Needed: This exemption request is for the duration of 2015.
