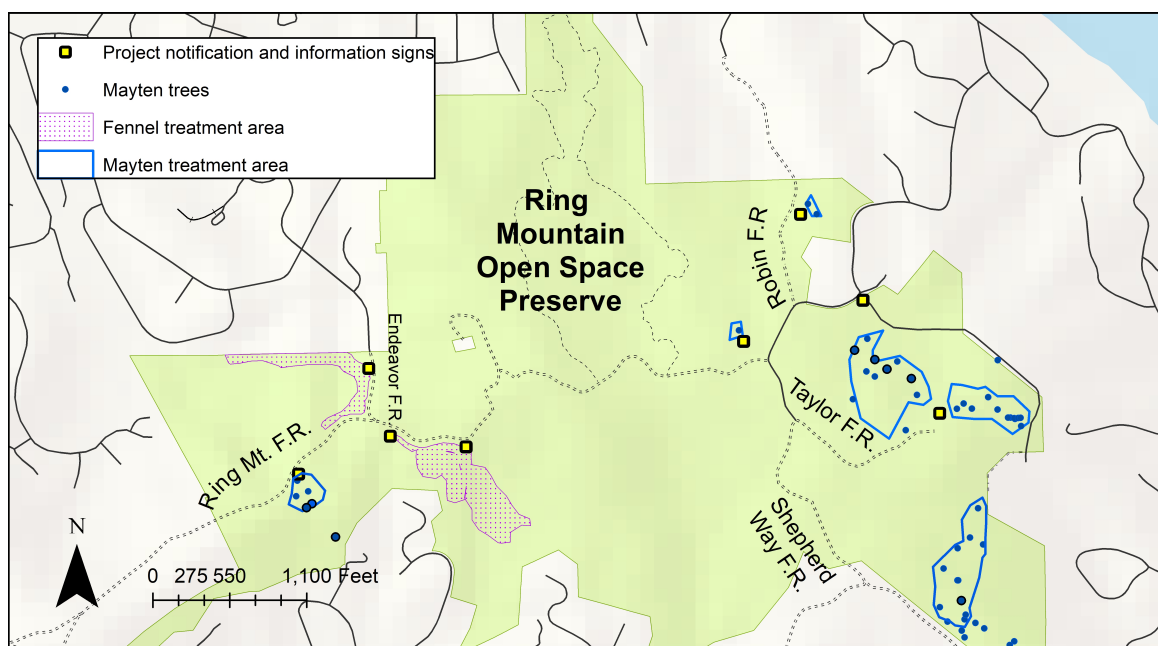

# PREVENTING INVASIVE MAYTEN & FENNEL

SEPTEMBER 13 - 21, 2021



Chilean Mayten and Fennel are fast-growing invasive plants, which can spread quickly if left unmanaged. Staff carefully places a small amount of herbicide, by hand, onto the trunk or stem of a plant.

Stopping the spread of these invasive species helps to protect rare species like the Tiburon Mariposa Lily.
